Professor Nan Seuffert is the Director of the Legal Intersections Research Centre at the School of Law at the University of Wollongong. Prior to academia, Nan practiced law in Boston at Foley, Hoag and Eliot. Her book, titled *Jurisprudence of National Identity*, provided the theme for the US Association for the Study of Law, Culture and the Humanities Conference in 2011. In 2016 she will be visiting at the Centre for the Study of Law and Society at Boalt Hall Law School, University of California at Berkeley. She teaches and researches in the areas of critical legal theory, securities regulation and contracts. Much of Nan's research focuses on women and the law.
